We do have quite a few activities going on in November, even amid Covid!

**Election Day is November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 7 AM to 7 PM at the FICC.** Folks from the Beaufort County Election Commission will have everything set up to allow for social distancing and overall safety. Please remember that, due to our COVID response plan, **neither the restrooms nor the kitchen will be accessible.** Please note that we will be working with Second Helpings Food Bank to coordinate a **Food Drive for election day.** Second Helpings will accept non-perishable items and cash donations.
